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Building Update

Almost all of the asphalt paving is complete, just one more section to pave. That will happen when the old youth building is removed, probably by August 20. All of the grading for the main sanctuary is complete, and the footings will begin to be dug by July 30. The sanctuary should be done by February 28, 2002. The new youth building should be completed at about the same time as the sanctuary. It will go where the old youth building is.

Most of the landscaping is complete, except for around the new sanctuary. When we are moved into the new sanctuary, then the existing barn will be remodeled and turned into classrooms for the kids. Once all the work is completed, around March 1, 2002 or so ... we can plant the upper portion of the property with pine trees.

The plans for the entire property are outside after every service. Please feel free to look through them and ask any questions you might have. This is God's church, and we are His people, so we'll simply be flexible and yielded to whatever God wants to do and in the way He wants to do it, Amen?

So may our Lord Jesus Christ richly bless you as you worship Him in Spirit and truth.

I'd like to share my response to him. I'd like to address each issue you brought up:

1. You said: "I feel" twice in your opening statement, once regarding "trust and faith," the other regarding "forgiveness"... Fortunately, our trust and faith in Jesus Christ is NOT based on how we "feel" but on the Word of God. Either we believe the Word of God or we don't ... Romans 12:3: *"each man has been given a measure of faith,"* Ephesians 2:8-9: faith is a gift of God. We all have been given faith; the question is, where are we going to put it, in God's Word or in how we "feel"?

So, too, it is with "forgiveness" (Psalm 103:12) that He has removed our sins as far as the east is from the west, (endless)... Hebrews 8:12: I will remember your sins no more. Now, aren't you glad that God has not only "removed" but also "forgotten" our of all our sins?

2. You mentioned about not being "right" with God until some "issues" are "resolved." Fortunately, our "right" standing before God does not depend on our performance. It all hinges on the finished work of Jesus Christ on the cross, by His shed blood (Romans 3:21-31).

Yes, we do need to do the right thing while on this earth, no doubt about that! But our righteousness, or justification before God is from God (Romans 3:24, 1 John 1:9, Isaiah 61:10, Psalm 132:9, 16, 2 Chronicles. 6:41) Not us!!! Praise the Lord!!!

3. You mentioned that you don't know what Jesus would have you to do. We can know exactly what Jesus wants us to do all the time in every situation, through His Word. Don't take the advice of man, but go to the Word of God. It is truth and a light to our path (John 17:17, 1 John 5:6, Psalm 119:105).
4. You say you're "lost and don't know what to do." Turn to the Word of God; it is the "owner's manual" for life. Often, we know what to do; we know right from wrong. What we really need to know is "HOW" to do it and the how part is only by the GRACE of God ... anything and everything is only accomplished by His GRACE. First of all, for Salvation, we are saved by GRACE (Ephesians 2:8-9). Second of all, for daily living by the same GRACE (Acts 20:32, Romans 1:5, 5:3, 2 Corinthians.4:15, 2 Tim. 2:1, Titus 2:11-12,

And if by grace, then is it no more of works: otherwise grace is no more grace. But if it be of works, then is it no more grace: otherwise work is no more work. Romans 11:6

Hebrews 12:28, 13:9). Look all of these up in your Bible. We need God's GRACE for salvation and everything in our lives everyday ... and there is only way to receive God's GRACE. 1 Peter 5:5, James 4:6 HUMILITY ... as we humble ourselves and confess that we can't save ourselves or live a Godly life on earth, God gives us GRACE for BOTH, so that we can accomplish His will. Praise the Lord!!!

If we are born again, we trust, by faith in God's ability to save us and to take us into eternity, right? Well, why not trust Him with these few short years on this earth? It's the same God, the same us, and the same GRACE nothing has changed, Amen?

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Brother Wil in India

“And into whatsoever house ye enter, first say, Peace be to this house. And if the son of

peace be there, your peace shall rest upon it: if not, it shall turn to you again. And in the same house remain, eating and drinking such things as they give: for the laborer is worthy of his hire. Go not from house to house.” Luke 10:5-7

We were all set to send Brother Wil to India. The plans were made; the airline tickets were purchased; nothing was left to be done. We had called Isaac and Sushma at the orphanage in India one last time to confirm our arrival date. We were ready to go. We had planned our ways, but Jesus was about to direct our path.

It is probably important to give a little background on how Jesus had opened the door and called Wil to India. Wil was a Hindi monk who had traveled to India to become a hermit in the ice caves of Gangoti. It was there in his search for “god” that Jesus found him. He was on a suspension bridge walking the trail that led up to the top of the mountain when he found himself unable to move. He did not know why, but after several minutes decided that it was “God’s” way of telling him that he was not to go and become a hermit. He packed up and prepared to return to New Delhi. While waiting for the bus, he noticed an Indian woman walking by. He caught her attention, so she came over. Wil proceeded to share all that had just happened to him. She looked right at him and said, “You need Jesus!” Her name was Sushma. She and her husband Isaac ran an orphanage in Dehra Dun. It was through their testimony that Wil came to know Jesus as Lord and Savior, and it was through them that Wil received an invitation to return to India.

We ended up flying on KLM airlines, which put us in Amsterdam for four hours. This was an incredible blessing because it meant that we would be able to spend some time with our Brother Ralf who was on furlough in the Netherlands for a couple of months. The flight went well until Detroit. It was canceled due to technical problems. We ended up having to wait almost four hours to catch another flight and missed our connection from Amsterdam to New Delhi. At first, this was very distressing, but then we realized that instead of four hours in Amsterdam, Jesus had given us a whole day to spend with our brother Ralf! It was a great time of encouraging both him and us in all the Jesus had been doing,

“Having many things to write unto you, I would not write with paper and ink: but I trust to come unto you, and speak face to face, that our joy may be full.”

II John 12

From there we were off to India, rather certain that nothing else unexpected would happen. We arrived in New Delhi, but none of our luggage made it with us. We sat in the airport until about 4:00 a.m. waiting to see if we would have clothes to wear. God provided. Not only did the luggage come through, but we were also given a fair sum of money for the inconvenience. Our train was scheduled to leave from Delhi at 7:30 a.m. We arrived in plenty of time only to find that the train was overbooked, and the next available train would not leave for two days. We needed another option.

The only other way was to rent a car and driver. Praise the Lord! It cost us exactly what we had been given by the airlines for our luggage being late. Six hours later, almost delirious from jet lag, we arrived in Dehra Dun.

As soon as we arrived at the orphanage, we knew that something was not right. The plan was for Wil to stay at the orphanage for about six months while he acclimated to the culture. What we found out was that Jesus had a very different plan. Only two days before we arrived, the church that supports Isaac and Sushma had laid down an ultimatum that no one who was not from the church could stay at the orphanage even for one night. If they allowed Wil to stay, they would lose all support for them and the children. Heartbroken and confused, we rented a hotel room in the city, sent out some emails asking for prayer, spent some time prayer ourselves, and exhausted, finally went to sleep.

The next morning took a good portion of the morning just seeking Jesus. I was scheduled to leave Wil and return to New Delhi that evening, and we had no idea of what we should do. We checked email; Ralph had written, encouraging us to contact some of the Christians that he had met while he was in India. One in particular caught Wil’s attention, a Christian bookstore. It was not easy to find, but we did manage to get there.

What happened next is difficult to fully describe. At this point, we were completely uncertain of what was going to happen. We were in an unfamiliar city that had little to no evidence of Jesus anywhere. When we walked into that bookstore, an incredible peace came over us. There were Bibles on the shelves and Christian music playing softly in the

A Friend Tells the Truth

Ointment and perfume delight the heart, And the sweetness of a man's friend gives delight by hearty counsel.
Proverbs 27:9

One of the benefits of attaining our senior years is that of hindsight. We can look back at our lives and see those certain good times and the testing (bad) times. We can remember when we made great decisions and the “not-so-great” decisions. We are sometimes haunted by our regrets over actions we took that were not correct or done in haste without careful thought.

We have reached that age in life when we can see more behind us than ahead of us. Time is passing, and we cannot avoid the results. I believe that it was Satchel Paige, the gifted baseball player, who said in his senior years, “Don’t look back; they may be gaining on you.”

Over the years, we have made the acquaintance of many people. From those meetings, we have made a few friends. What is the difference between an acquaintance and a friend? I believe that a friend is that person who will tell you the truth with love at all times. He wants only your good for your life.

Faithful are the wounds of a friend, But the kisses of an enemy are deceitful.
Proverbs 27:6

This Bible verse declares that the advice from a faithful friend sometimes hurts, but it is meant for good, whereas the words from an enemy are hurtful since he will only tell you what he knows you want to hear. An example of this would be if a friend tells you that your purple shirt and green pants do not go well together. However, your less than a friend will tell you that it looks great.

This Bible verse declares that an encouraging word from a loyal friend will lift our spirits during those times when we need support from our faithful friends. This is a person whose company we seek or call up when we experience hard times.

I would like for you to consider me a true friend who desires to share a vital truth with you. So often, people turn other people off if the discussion is about anything but the weather. The weather affects us daily, but how about something that will affect us for eternity. Now, I know you will say, “Hold it, stop right there. I do not want to talk about things that last beyond tomorrow, much less for eternity.” I beg you to reconsider and hear me out. What I have to say to you will affect you for eternity.

For I am not ashamed of the gospel of Christ, for it is the power of God to salvation for everyone who believes, for the Jew first and also for the Greek.
Romans 1:16

Some might say, “I do not believe in eternity.” However, consider this. You may stand at the top of the Empire State Building and say gravity will not affect me and then jump off. In spite of your convincing belief in a nontruth, you will end up a big splat on the sidewalk below. All the way down, you will be shrieking in agony saying, “I was wrong; I was wrong. Why didn’t I listen to my friend who was trying to tell me the truth?”

I am your friend, and I implore you to hear me now as I tell you a sure truth, whether you understand it for now or believe it if you do understand it. Remember the Bible verse above that says

a friend tells you a truth even though it may go against your preconceived ideas. That is what I am attempting to do now.

If I were able to predict to you the exact winner of the Kentucky Derby for five years in a row before the race was run, I certainly would have your attention. There is a proven prediction in our Bibles with over 300 predictions all about Jesus. The odds of all these predictions coming to pass is so great that if we wanted to use an example, we would take a silver dollar and mark it with red paint. Next, we would place it in the State of Texas and pile other dollars three feet deep all over the state. Then, we blindfold you and tell you to find that marked dollar from all the rest in the whole state of Texas. You have one chance to grab the right one. Those are immense odds. Yet, those are the odds that one man could fulfill just eight of all the 300 prophecies as given in the Bible. That man is Jesus.

I am here to tell you that all the prophecies have been fulfilled by Jesus. Now, don’t you think that is enough evidence to cause you to reconsider your decision about Jesus?

The Bible has a great verse about reasoning in Isaiah:

“Come now, and let us reason together,” Says the LORD, “Though your sins are like scarlet, They shall be as white as snow; Though they are red like crimson, They shall be as wool.”
Isaiah 1:18

Why do people refuse to accept a calm reasoning about the person of Jesus? There is more historical evidence about Jesus than Shakespeare. The Bible has the answer for use in these verses:



For the wrath of God is revealed from heaven against all ungodliness and unrighteousness of men, who suppress the truth in unrighteousness, because what may be known of God is manifest in them, for God has shown it to them. For since the creation of the world His invisible attributes are clearly seen, being understood by the things that are made, even His eternal power and Godhead, so that they are without excuse, because, although they knew God, they did not glorify Him as God, nor were thankful, but became futile in their thoughts, and their foolish hearts were darkened. Professing to be wise, they became fools, and changed the glory of the incorruptible God into an image made like corruptible man — and birds and four-footed animals and creeping things. Therefore God also gave them up to uncleanness, in the lusts of their hearts, to dishonor their bodies among themselves, who exchanged the truth of God for the lie, and worshiped and served the creature rather than the Creator, who is blessed forever. Amen. Romans 1:18-25

This last verse relates to those who believe in the theory of evolution as opposed to the Biblical account of creation.

It is never too late to have a change of heart and believe that Jesus is the Son of God and that He came to restore fellowship between man and God.

There was a learned elderly man who came to see Jesus to seek the truth.

There was a man of the Pharisees named Nicodemus, a ruler of the Jews. This man came to Jesus by night and said to Him, "Rabbi, we know that You are a teacher come from God; for no one can do these signs that You do unless God is with him." Jesus answered and said to him, "Most assuredly, I say to you, unless one is born again, he cannot see the kingdom of God." Nicodemus said to Him, "How can a man be born when he is old? Can he enter a second

time into his mother's womb and be born?" Jesus answered, "Most assuredly, I say to you, unless one is born of water and the Spirit, he cannot enter the kingdom of God. "That which is born of the flesh is flesh, and that which is born of the Spirit is spirit. "Do not marvel that I said to you, 'You must be born again.' "The wind blows where it wishes, and you hear the sound of it, but cannot tell where it comes from and where it goes. So is everyone who is born of the Spirit." Nicodemus answered and said to Him, "How can these things be?" Jesus answered and said to him, "Are you the teacher of Israel, and do not know these things? "Most assuredly, I say to you, We speak what We know and testify what We have seen, and you do not receive Our witness. "If I have told you earthly things and you do not believe, how will you believe if I tell you heavenly things? "No one has ascended to heaven but He who came down from heaven, that is, the Son of Man who is in heaven. "And as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, even so must the Son of Man be lifted up, "that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have eternal life. "For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life. "For God did not send His Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world through Him might be saved. "He who believes in Him is not condemned; but he who does not believe is condemned already, because he has not believed in the name of the only begotten Son of God. "And this is the condemnation, that the light has come into the world, and men loved darkness rather than light, because their deeds were evil. John 3:1-19

I pray that you have read this far and have been willing to consider the truths I have set before you. If you

desire to be born again, all you have to do is say a simple prayer in the privacy of your heart.

Just say, "Father, I am a sinner. Thank you for sending your Son, Jesus, to die on the cross for my sins. I say with my tongue and believe in my heart that Jesus is the Savior, and I ask Him to come into my heart right now and be my Lord. Thank you for the promise of the Holy Spirit that helps me understand all things spiritual. Amen.

"And whatever you ask in My name, that I will do, that the Father may be glorified in the Son. If you ask anything in My name, I will do it. If you love Me, keep My commandments. And I will pray the Father, and He will give you another Helper, that He may abide with you forever — the Spirit of truth, whom the world cannot receive, because it neither sees Him nor knows Him; but you know Him, for He dwells with you and will be in you. I will not leave you orphans; I will come to you. John 14:15-18

At our age, can you afford to wait another day to investigate this matter of eternal consequence? Do you have another friend who has told you this also? Don't you think that it is time to give your heart to this proven logic which is so sensible and best of all, it is free. You cannot work your way to heaven. You cannot buy your way to heaven. It is by grace which is freely given by God.

Israel 2001

Pilgrimage

This is the first in a series that will walk you (mostly uphill) through the Israel 2001 trip. We arrived at LAX on Monday morning, February 26, before 10:00 am. We arrived in Tel Aviv Tuesday evening, due to the time change.

Wednesday, February 28, 7:45 AM

We departed the hotel in Tel Aviv and traveled a little over a mile to Jaffa (Joppa in Bible times) for a teaching on the Acropolis overlooking Jaffa. Jaffa was built, destroyed, and rebuilt 25 times over 4000 years.

In 116 BC, the cedar logs were floated from Lebanon to Jerusalem through the Jaffa port. The logs were used to build the temple being built by Solomon.

In 816 BC, Jonah was called to go to Ninevah (capitol of Assyria). Jonah caught a boat in Joppa going to Tarshish (the opposite direction of Ninevah). Jonah was to tell Ninevah that in 40 days God would destroy them. Jonah was afraid that Ninevah would repent, so he went in the opposite direction. Jonah 2:8. They did repent, and God had mercy!

In A.D. 40, Peter had been in Lyda (Ben Gurion Airport area outside of Tel Aviv) when he raised Dorcas from the dead. Acts 9:36-43. It was in Jaffa that Peter stayed with Simon the Tanner and had the vision of the animals, clean and unclean, and God told him to eat, and he objected, three times. Then the messenger from Cornelius came and asked him to go to Cornelius in Caesarea. Jaffa is the location from which God opened the door for the Gentiles. Acts 9:43 – 10:48. In Joffa, we saw what is widely believed to be the house of Simon the Tanner.

We overlooked the Sorek Valley from the Tel of Beth Shemesh. A Tel is a hill resulting from building city upon city. This is where Samson tied the foxes' tails together with torches tied to them. He then released the foxes into the fields of the Philistines in the Sorek Valley and burned up their fields. (Judges 15). The Sorek Valley is where Samson encountered Delilah. (Judges 16). This valley was also known as the Valley of Confrontation. It is where both the Jews and Philistines gathered to battle. The Jews controlled the high country, and the Philistines controlled the plains. The Sorek Valley leads to Timnah (Judges 15). Samson's sin resulted in blindness, judgment (chains of brass), and grinding.

From Ekron, the Philistines sent the Ark of the Covenant away with two milk cows who had never had a yoke and had recently had calves. They hitched the cows to the cart, released the cows, and the cows headed due north, straight for Beth Shemesh. 1 Samuel 6.

1:55 PM

Next, we found ourselves in the Elah Valley where for 40 days Goliath challenged the Israelites. Goliath was about 9'6" tall. David asked "... *who is this uncircumcised Philistine, that he should taunt the armies of the living God?*" (1 Sam 17:26). He took five smooth stones from the brook and felled Goliath with a stone in his forehead (1 Samuel 17:49).

You too can select a stone(s) from the dry brook — but your luggage will get heavier.

3:00 PM

The Road to Emmaus, where Jesus joined the two disciples after His resurrection. He explained to the disciples what had happened from the Law through the prophets (Luke 24). "Did not our hearts burn within us as He shared the Word?"

Thursday, March 1

We saw sand dunes on the way from Tel Aviv to Caesarea. Herod the Great built Caesarea as a show place for the pagans and to honor Caesar Augustus. Herod's father converted to Judaism but not his mother. He built Jerusalem to make the Jews happy. The theater in Caesarea is only a 1/2 theater (not an amphitheater). About 27 years ago, archaeologists found a stone tablet inside the theater with the name of Pontius Pilate on it. The theater can seat 4,700 people and is the best preserved. They found 2 Hippodromes here. We walked through the ruins of the port city Caesarea, which had just been opened. The first Gothic arches were built here. Due to the trade in Caesarea, Alexandria and Cleopatra ceased to be important to Rome as a trade center. Caesarea was the largest port in the world. The fountains had salt water in them.

Philip the Evangelist had his home in Caesarea. The Roman Centurian,

Cornelius, lived here (Acts 10:1). It was not good for a Jew (Peter) to go to the house of a Gentile (Cornelius). Paul was in the house of Philip when Agabus gave the prophecy of Paul's death (Acts 21:10).

We sat in the theater, which was built 120 B.C. by the son of Herod the Great. Herod Antipas, the son of Herod the Great, was set up in Tiberius. Herod Antipas ordered the death of John the Baptist. The Son of Herod Antipas was Herod Agrippa I. He stood in this theater with a great robe that reflected the sun and the people cried: *"The voice of a god and not of a man!"* an angel of the Lord struck him, and he was eaten with worms and died (Acts 12:23).

Herod Agrippa II heard Paul's defense in this theater (Acts 26:2). Herod's wife, Bernice came to visit with Festus. Herod agreed to hear Paul in the theater (Acts 26). Paul gives his testimony and gives his commission (Acts 26:18).

12:30 PM

We visited Mount Carmel, the northern kingdom of Israel (I Kings 18). It is on the way to two trade routes: 1. Via Mares (Way of the Sea, which we traveled from Caesarea to Mt. Carmel), and 2. King's Highway. Mt. Carmel is 1500' high. It is named the Burn Place, where Elijah set up sacrifices and fire came down from heaven. From Mt. Carmel, we overlooked the Valley of Megiddo to the left and the plain of Estralon. An Israeli airstrip is below us near the valley of Megiddo. Megiddo is the bread basket of Israel.

2:30 PM

While we were receiving a teaching at the Tel of Megiddo, we heard a noise, sirens, and helicopter. We later learned that police had stopped an Arab/Palestinian who had left a bomb in Tel Aviv on Wednesday while we were there), and he blew up the car and killed a Palestinian and injured 9 people. Revelation 16: there may be 200 million warriors.

From here, we viewed Mt. Tabor which some speculate was the Mount of Transfiguration. Others believe that Mt. Hermon is the mountain upon which the transfiguration took place. If Mt. Tabor was the Mount of Transfiguration, Jesus, Moses and Elijah would have looked over the Valley of Megiddo.

After leaving Megiddo, we drove through Nazareth. Two synagogues were built by Christians: one in Nazareth, and one in Capernaum. Nazareth was comprised of only 60-80 families during the time of Jesus. Capernaum, according to Roni our guide, was the home base of Jesus.

We then drove through the city of Cana, which is adjacent to Nazareth, where Jesus turned the water into wine at a marriage. We ended the day by driving to the Sea of Galilee and staying in Tiberius.

May your pilgrimages through your Christian walk bring you closer to our Lord Jesus Christ.



Jabez ... Reflections on Blessings and Territories

And Jabez called on the God of Israel saying, "Oh, that You would bless me indeed, and enlarge my territory, that Your hand would be with me, and that You would keep me from evil, that I may not cause pain!" So God granted him what he requested.

1 Chronicles 4:10

The book *The Prayer of Jabez* has brought one small verse of the Bible under much discussion and into the prayer lives of many Christians. I'm one of them. Until I read this book by Bruce Wilkinson, prayed for understanding, and meditated on the verse, I fluctuated back and forth as to whether the prayer was selfish. I now believe that it is just the opposite.

Jabez was a descendent of Caleb. Caleb and Joshua were the only two of the 12 scouts who went into the land of Canaan and came back and reported to the Israelites that they should go in and take the land of Canaan as the Lord had commanded. The Israelites refused. Consequently, God let them wander in the wilderness until all who had rebelled died. Only Joshua and Caleb lived from this generation, and Joshua and Caleb were allowed to enter Canaan (Numbers 13-14). Although Moses had not rebelled, as a consequence of misrepresenting God, he was not allowed to enter Canaan. When the next generation of Israelites finally entered the land of Canaan and land was given to the tribes, Caleb asked for the mountain where the Anakim (giants) lived as his portion. Caleb's land is now Hebron (in the news today)! Caleb was a pretty crusty 85-year-old (Joshua 14). This was the stock of Jabez.

Jabez asked God to bless him, but he left it up to God as to how He would bless him. Along with blessing, Jabez asked God to enlarge his territory. Some believe that perhaps Jabez was facing a battle. We face battles, and we win or lose territory every day. What if we were to ask God to have His perfect way in blessing us and enlarging our territories for His kingdom? Oh, the battles we would face! We would need God's hand to be with us, and we'd need our precious Father to keep us from evil, for just as Jabez, we would not want to cause pain (the word "Jabez" means sorrow).

With territory, comes responsibility: care, maintenance, development — stewardship. In this fast-paced world, that's all we need is additional responsibility, or is it? Jesus said, "... *For unto whomsoever much is given, of him shall be much required: and to whom men have committed much, of him they will ask the more,*" Luke 12:48. That's why we need the rest of the prayer.

This prayer is costly. It requires Jabez to step out in faith to claim that territory and trust that the Lord will keep His hand upon him and keep him from evil. Yet, when we step out in faith, we're taking a risk — just where God does His most perfect and glorious work! That's when we have to say that we were unable to accomplish the task and that only with the blessing of God, it was accomplished. The last sentence is matter-of-fact: God granted him his request. Will God grant our request if we ask Him with this attitude? Many people have begun to pray that prayer for the Lord's kingdom. Keith and I are two of them. It's become quite an adventure.

Just one verse that has made all the difference in the world to many. May the Lord bless you, indeed, and enlarge your territory; may His hand be with you and keep you from evil that you may not cause pain.

*What then shall we say to these things? If God is for us, who can be against us? He who did not spare His own Son, but delivered Him up for us all, how shall He not with Him also freely give us all things? Who shall bring a charge against God's elect? It is God who justifies. Who is he who condemns? It is Christ who died, and furthermore is also risen, who is even at the right hand of God, who also makes intercession for us. Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? Shall tribulation, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril, or sword? As it is written: "For Your sake we are killed all day long; We are accounted as sheep for the slaughter." Yet in all these things we are more than conquerors through Him who loved us. For I am persuaded that **neither death nor life, nor angels nor principalities nor powers, nor things present nor things to come, nor height nor depth, nor any other created thing, shall be able to separate us from the love of God which is in Christ Jesus our Lord.** Romans 8:31-39*

Martin Luther's Sword

Tucked away in a short three-chapters book in the Old Testament is the answer to the prophet's question of "Why?" Habakuk was in turmoil because of unanswered prayer. Violence, wickedness and contention were all that he saw. He said, "How long will I call for help and no help is forthcoming?" Then came the cry, "Why, Lord?"

God's answer was, "I am already working in your day, and you will not believe what I am going to do." He went on to say that He was raising up the Babylonians, Israel's greatest enemy, to punish Israel for its disobedience, idolatry and injustices. This really floored the prophet, and he decided to wait and see what the Lord would speak to him. God answered him, and among other things said, *"the righteous will live by his faith."* Habakuk 2:4.

The great apostle, Paul, in defining the gospel as the power of God unto salvation, said that the righteousness of God is revealed *"from faith to faith as it is written, 'the righteous shall live by faith.'"* Romans 1:17. God's righteousness comes to sinful men by faith, not works. He again uses that verse a few years later when writing to the Galatians who were struggling with the problem of the relationship of the law to grace and writes, *"now that no one is justified by the law before God is evident, for the righteous man shall live by faith."* Galatians 3:11. The writer of Hebrews seeking to keep his Christian readers from discouragement with the temptation to return to Judaism writes, *"for yet a very little while, He who is coming will come and not delay, but my righteous one shall live by faith."* Hebrews 10:37-38. Habakuk's verse seems to give the theme of these three New Testament books:

"The righteous . . . shall live . . . by faith." Romans 1:17; Galatians 3:11; Hebrews 10:38.

This verse pierced the heart of a searching priest, Martin Luther, some 2600 years later producing the Reformation which was to liberate millions of people into full salvation, charging a culture and the history of our modern world.

But the Reformer did not do it alone; there were others — The Reformation in Switzerland arose independently of that in Germany, though simultaneously with it. The leader was Zwingli, who in 1522 broke away from Rome. The movement became more radical than in Germany. It spread to Scandinavia then France and Holland.

The movement in England began in the reign of Henry VIII. One of the leaders of the English Reformation was John Tyndale, who translated the New Testament into English. He was martyred in 1536. Henry VIII broke with Rome because the pope would not sanction his divorce, and he established the English Catholic Church with himself as the head. This became the Anglican Church of England.

In Scotland, John Knox (1505-1572) assumed the leadership of the Reformed movement. His renowned prayer was, "Give me Scotland, or I die!" The Presbyterian Church became the Church of Scotland.

In France, the leader was John Calvin (1509-1564) who was called by many "the greatest theologian after Augustine." He was born near Paris and trained as a pious Catholic preparing for the priesthood. He possessed an extraordinary intellect, good sense with a fondness for plain logic. In 1532, he came under the influence of Luther, and his concept of salvation. He failed to find peace in the Catholic



Church and the following year had a dramatic "road to Damascus" conversion. In his own words, he said, "God himself produced the change and instantly subdued my heart to obedience."

Calvin's greatest literary contribution was "The Institutes of the Christian Religion" which was published in defense of the persecuted evangelicals of France in 1536 when he was only 27 years old. It is a brief manual of Christian doctrine and forms the basis for reformed theology today.

His greatest contributions to the Reformation were:

1. He was the most influential and intellectual leader of the movement.
2. He laid much stress on education using the catechetical system of question/answer method.
3. His literary output was amazing with over 250 commentaries on the Bible.
4. Calvin impacted the development of the modern French languages.
5. His major influence was on students, lawyers, and professionals; he barely touched the illiterate and lower classes.

This was Luther's forte and sphere of influence, being a man of the common people who spoke their language.

In the next issue, we will be looking at John Calvin's theology and also at that of James Arminius (1560-1609) who reacted strongly to Calvinism.

My Father's Vineyard

I am the vine, ye are the branches: He that abideth in me, and I in him, the same bringeth forth much fruit: for without me ye can do nothing. If a man abide not in me, he is cast forth as a branch, and is withered; and men gather them, and cast them into the fire, and they are burned. If ye abide in me, and my words abide in you, ye shall ask what ye will, and it shall be done unto you. Herein is my Father glorified, that ye bear much fruit; so shall ye be my disciples. John 15:5-8

From 1990-1999, I tended Merlot grapes, waited for them to mature, gathering the fruit, crushing the grapes, and bottling several gallons of grape juice a year to be used for weekly communion at a local church in Ramona, California.

This is my favorite time of the year in the vineyard. The ever-lengthening days are upon us. All the vines that were so neatly trimmed, their branches are gently twisting around the wire strung from posts that stand in tidy rows. It will not be long that another cycle of fruitfulness will occur. It seems that only a few months ago, the air was filled with dust, voices, and the churning of a tractor engine that marked the frenzied drive to harvest the grapes before the first rain. But now, it is quiet, and I am alone here to walk and talk with the Father.

Since the vineyard is where He revealed much to me, it is no wonder to me that when Jesus wanted to reveal the kingdom to His followers, He, too, chose a vineyard for His teaching tool. On that long-awaited evening when He wanted to tell them how to live fruitful lives of rich personal fulfillment, where did He take them? To a vineyard — to His Father's vineyard. *"I am the true vine,"* He told them. Perhaps Jesus spotted a small strand of vines near the Garden of Gethsemane. I can imagine Him walking over to a grapevine, affectionately taking one of the tender grape clusters in His hand and inviting His



disciples to gather around as He launched into one of the most intriguing stories of His ministry.

Our family had purchased the property from an older couple who had spent many years tending to all the needs of the vineyard. They provided me with strict instructions on how to care for the vineyard. It did not take much time for me to realize that I could not dedicate the time the strict instructions called for. The older couple we purchased the property from truly cared most deeply about the vineyard.

The same is true in God's vineyard. Jesus is the true Vine; we are the branches, and our heavenly Father is the Owner and the Gardener. That means, of course that God is in charge. He can do whatever He pleases in the vineyard. We are merely branches, for even we who labor in His vineyard, have no rights to question His decisions.

Regrettably, there are times when I spend the bulk of my prayer time trying to counsel God to resolve my situation in the way that I imagine best. Foolishly, I forget that this is my Father's vineyard. He knows what He is doing and doesn't need my counsel. When we are in pain, when we can't see a way out, when the days drag by without solutions, He comes to us with tenderness and incredible love. This is the Gardener I have grown to trust.
